

An exhibition of sculptures by Ursula von Rydingsvard in Orońsko in September

From September 4, the Polish Sculpture Center in Orońsko will host an exhibition of monumental sculptures by Ursula von Rydingsvard. The works of one of the most famous artists in the United States will be presented in the galleries and park of the Orońsko museum.

Initially, it was planned that the opening of the exhibition would take place on August 21. However, due to a delay in transporting the sculptures from New York, the opening of the exhibition was postponed to September 4.

"Today, four containers with monumental sculptures by Ursula von Rydingsvard have reached Orońsko. They are unloaded; we have over two weeks to prepare the exhibition" - Paweł Czyż from the Center of

Polish Sculpture in Orońsko informed PAP.

Ursula von Rydingsvard is an artist of Polish roots, but living and working in New York. From September 4 to October 17, her works will be exhibited at the Museum of Contemporary Sculpture, Galeria Oranżeria and the unique park space of the Orońsko center.

As announced by the organizers, the show prepared in Orońsko is to be a representative cross-section of Ursula von Rydingsvard's work. These will be sculptures made of cedar wood, animal intestines, polyurethane resin, drawings and installations.

Ursula von Rydingsvard - born July 26, 1942 - is one of the most famous artists in the United States. Her work can be found in major art collections and venues, such as the Museum of Modern Art in New York and the National Gallery of Art in Washington.

"Ursula von Rydingsvard is one of the few sculptors in the world who uses a unique monumental form, combining precision and diligence reminiscent of medieval artists with modern abstract art, which she has given its own unique character" - emphasized Czyż.

The opening of the exhibition "Only art" in Orońsko will take place on September 4. In autumn, the exhibition will also be presented at the National Museum in Krakow and Łazienki Królewskie in Warsaw (PAP)
